

## **Fast Facts for the M.S. in School Counseling Program**

**CACREP ACCREDITED THROUGH COTOBER 31, 2024**

\*The Master's in School Counseling Program has approximately 41 current students with 7 males and 34 females including 3 African American males, 1 African American female and 1 Hispanic male.

\*100% of the Master's students pass the Praxis Professional School Counselor exam following completion of the program.

\*During 2014-15, 14 students graduated with their Master's in School Counseling.

\*Many students are employed as professional school counselors PRIOR to program completion.

\*Approximately 99.9% of students have positions as professional school counselors prior to or within weeks of graduation.

\*Courses are offered in traditional on-campus, on-line and select video-conference formats. Courses accommodate both part-time and full-time students.

\*Multiple Graduate Teaching Assistantships and Graduate Research Assistantships are available to students.

\*Multiple scholarships are available to students in the M.S. in School Counseling program.

\*Selected current students are completing a Certificate in Counseling Military Connected Students and Families.

\*A teaching license is not required to becoming a professional school counselor in Kansas. One option for licensure is for those who have a professional teaching license; the second option, parallel pathway, is for individuals who do not have a professional teaching license. Parallel pathway criteria are integrated into existing coursework and do NOT require extra credit hours or tuition.

\*16 master's program applications were received during 2014.

\*Students are provided with support and encouragement to participate in professional school counseling professional development opportunities.

**Fast Facts for the PhD in Counselor Education and Supervision Program**  
**CACREP ACREDITED THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 2018**

\* The PhD in Counselor Education and Supervision Program has 16 students currently enrolled. Demographics include 11 females, 4 males, 1 Asian American, 1 multi-racial, and 1 African American.

\*Three PhD students graduated during 2014-2015.

\*100% of recent PhD graduates are working in the profession.

\*PhD alumni are primarily employed as counselor educators and/or other faculty positions at universities and colleges. All are licensed and a select number also engage in private practice.

\*Approximately 75% of students complete the program within the expected time rate.

\*Eight doctoral program applications were received during 2014.

\*Assistantships are available for PhD students.

\*KSU faculty teaching counseling courses include 4 females and 4 males 2 of which are Asian Americans and 1 African American.
