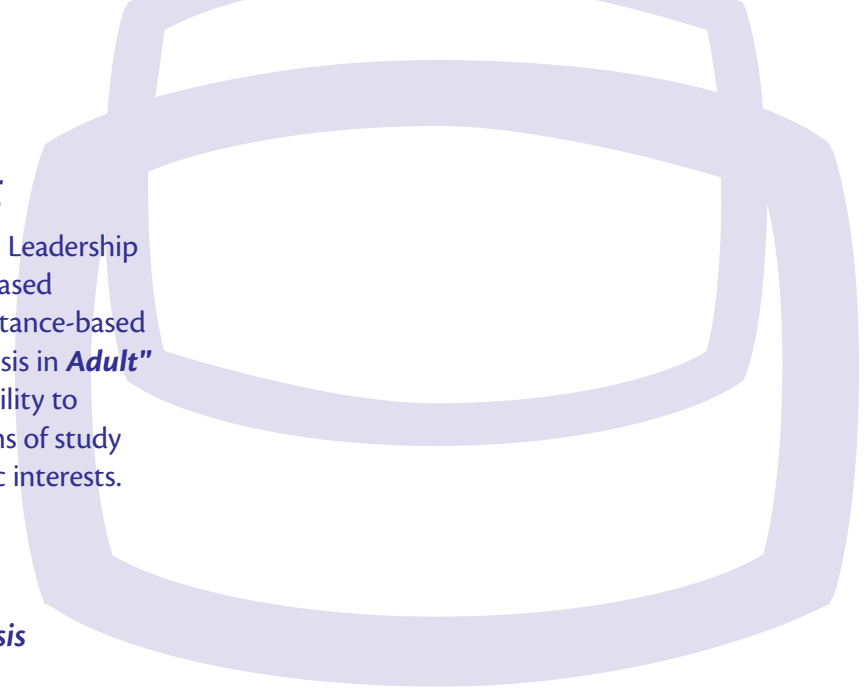

Delivery Method

The Faculty of Educational Leadership will deliver a **significant** portion of coursework leading to the M.S. degree primarily by distance delivery. Distance delivery includes web-based instruction and interactive video/audio.

Brief periods of concentrated study on the K-State campus are required in most cases—whenever possible, K-State faculty will travel to centralized locations for **face-to-face** interaction. For general definition purposes, any course marked as distance-delivery will be comprised of **at least 2/3** electronic interface.

Electives

In order that students can strengthen their content knowledge, students are allowed to take 6-9 credit hours in other departments and other accredited colleges and universities with the approval of their Master's committee members. Examples include: student personnel, statistics, business management, and sociology.



General Degree Requirements

Master's degrees (MS) in the Department of Educational Leadership are available in **Adult Education** (EDACE) and **Educational Administration** (EDADL). The MS in adult education requires a minimum 36 semester hours of coursework. All MS programs of study must be approved by a student's Master's committee.
