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# LEAPES CAMP REACHES NEARLY 500 STUDENTS

It's been another eventful summer for the LEAPES Camp, thanks to a nearly \$2.7 million grant through the Department of Defense to promote science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) degrees and careers throughout Kansas. LEAPES focuses on Learning, Exploration, and Application for Prospective Engineering Students.

The Rural Education Center was awarded the grant, under the National Defense Education Program (NDEP) in STEM, Biotechology, and Enhanced Civics Education. The REC partnered with the Center for Remote Sensing

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of Ice sheets (CReSIS) at the University of Kansas.

This summer 280 middle school students from 32 schools and 80 high school students and 10 high school teachers participated. A total of 360 students and about 50 teachers benefited from the grant this summer. Five more middle schools are set to participate asynchronously this fall, with an expected enrollment of 120. That brings the total to approximately 480 students.
